The red line of the data is our school, the blue line is similar schools, and the dark blue line is the state of Victoria. When you look at the graph related to absences, remember the shorter the line the better! You can clearly see our students have on average far less days absence than other schools and this is reflected in our high data for other areas. 




Student Attitudes to School - Management of Bullying



Absence from school can impact on students' learning. Common reasons for non-attendance include illness and extended family holidays.






Attendance Rate (latest year)
