



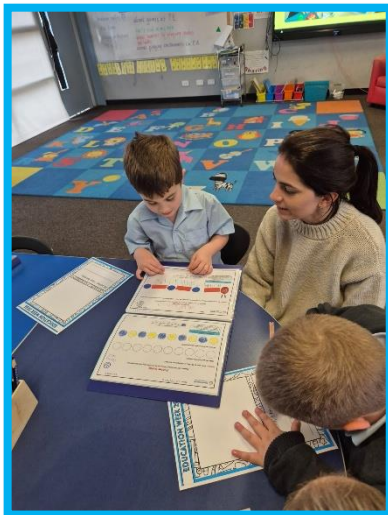

Every dollar raised supports The Pyjama Foundation's *Love of Learning Program*, helping kids in care.

The Pyjama Foundation exists to break the cycle of disadvantage for children in foster care (and out-of-home care), who face significantly poorer educational outcomes than their peers.

Without early intervention, many struggle with literacy and numeracy, leading to lifelong barriers in education, employment, and wellbeing.

Founded in 2004 by Bronwyn Sheehan OAM, the Foundation tackles this issue through its Love of Learning Program. Trained volunteers— called Pyjama Angels— are matched with a child in care, dedicating one hour a week to reading, learning, and mentorship.

We hope to all see you in your pyjamas next Wednesday!

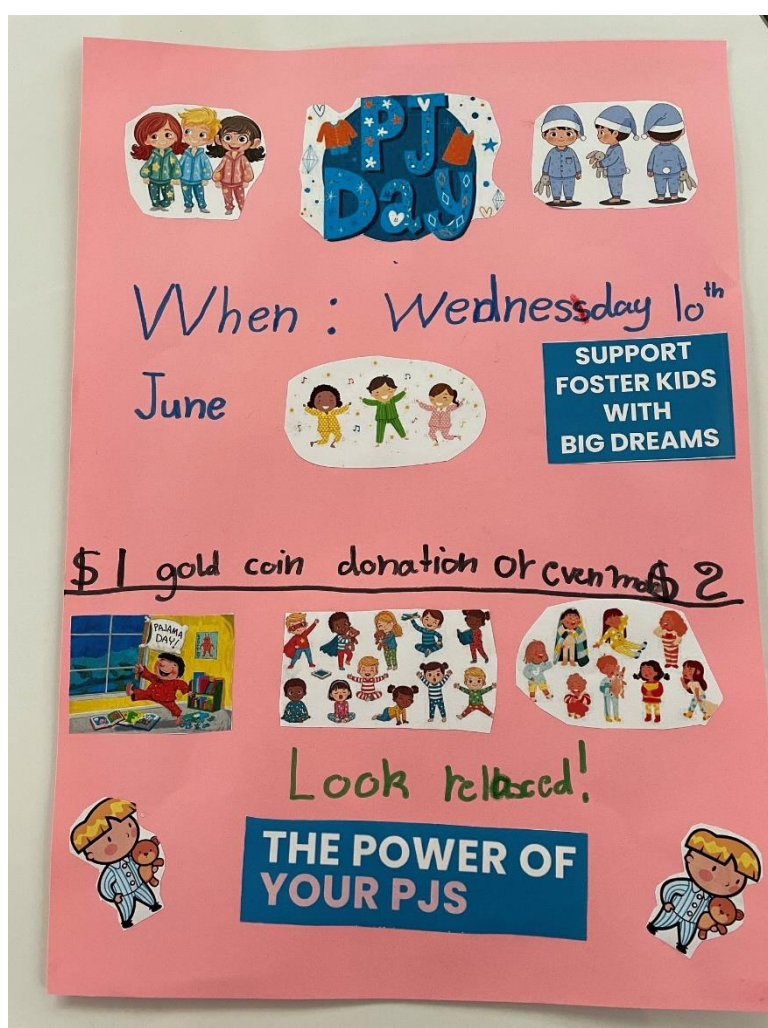
