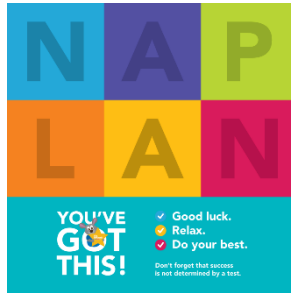




Today the Years 3s and 5s finished their final NAPLAN test.

Each Year Level will work on a wreath. Everyone is welcome to come and join us for a short ceremony in the gym.




