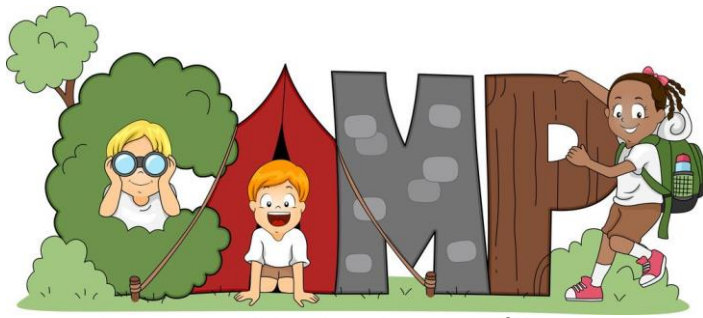

Next term there are two school camps coming up – one at Malmesbury for the 3/4 Learning Community and one at Kyneton for the 5/6 Learning Community.

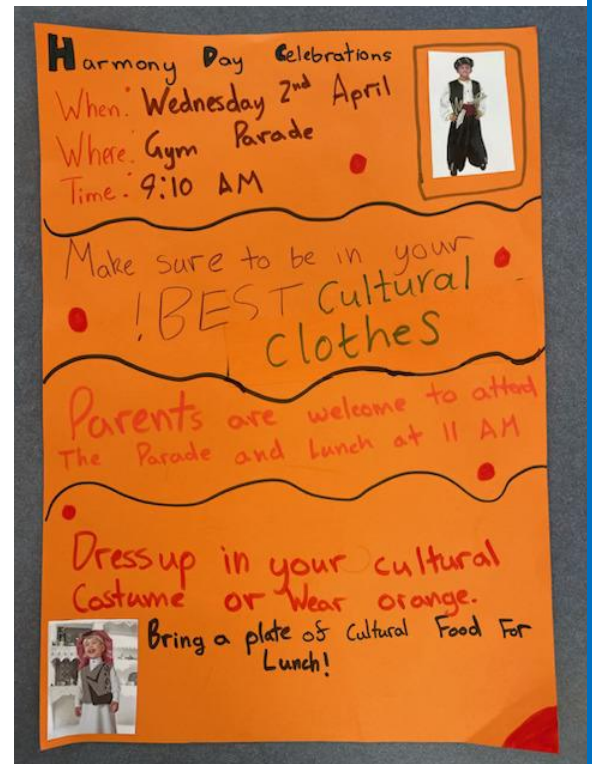

Bat Tennis –



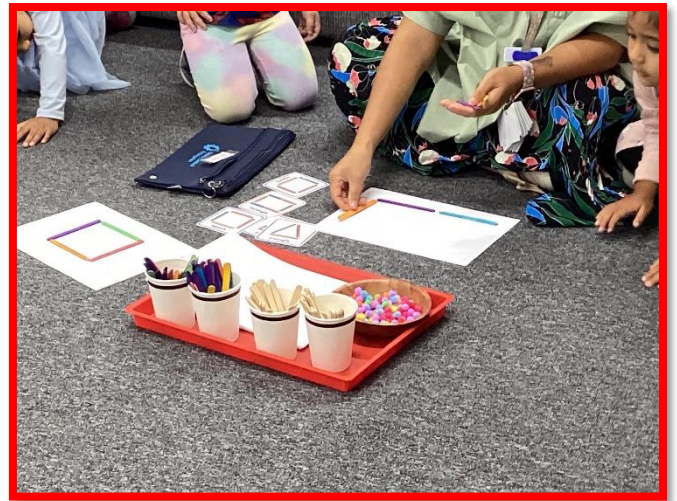
