Last Thursday, the 3/4 Learning

Community had an excursion to **IMAX and the Melbourne Museum** as part of their Investigations History unit. The students viewed 'Australia 3D' at IMAX in the morning. The 3/4s recalled how it was interesting to watch how Australia split from the large land mass and became its own

continent island.

In the afternoon, the students were led by the teachers as they explored the Forest Gallery, Milarri Garden and First Peoples Gallery. Some of the highlights of the galleries and garden included:





- Reading about the history of Coranderrk Aboriginal Station in the 1800s.
- Viewing and reading about the various native plants and how they were used by First Peoples.

The students learnt so much about Aboriginal history and the plants that were important to their cultural history.



Last Thursday, the **Year 5/6 students** set off on an adventure to **Sovereign Hill in Ballarat** as part of their history investigation for their exploration of the big question:

How did Australia become a nation?

Sovereign Hill is an outdoor museum that recreates life in a Victorian era mining town during the late 1800s.

Students took part in a

range of hands on learning experiences, including gold panning (and finding!) and watching demonstrations such as gold pouring and traditional sweet making. A highlight of the day was walking through the Red Hill Mine, experiencing the darkness and imagining what life might have been like for miners during the gold rush.





It wasn't all fun and games, though, students also took part in an insightful session exploring Aboriginal

perspectives and participated in role-play activities to better understand what life

was like for children of that era.

Overall, it was a fantastic excursion that gave students a real sense of connection to their Investigations topic and to Australian history more broadly.
